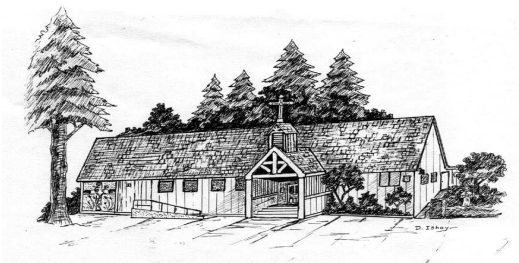

Dear St. Timothy's Church Family and Friends—

Last Tuesday we had a patient come into the clinic to have some staples removed from his head. He had fallen from a ladder and landed on his head. It split him open from his forehead all the way to the back of his neck. His girlfriend took him to the hospital in Crescent City where he was sent by air ambulance to a bigger hospital. His head needed 15 stitches and 26 staples. He also broke his neck and has several staples from some surgical procedure to mend his neck back together.

This man has no insurance. The bill for the hospital, surgery, and air ambulance is going to be an astronomical amount of money. He has no primary medical provider that can help him with the removal of the staples. His girlfriend told me that she thought that she could get the stitches out. But, she was queasy at the thought of trying to remove the staples. So they came to see if someone in our clinic could do the job. Our clinic staff is remarkable. One of our medical professionals took on the job, handling a tough task with a loving humor that put the patient at ease.

I'm not kidding when I say that the girlfriend had seriously considered removing the staples. She watched intently as they were expertly removed by our staff person, seeing if she maybe could have done it after all.

That is the kind of things people without access to health care think about. They often do things that they would never normally consider like becoming their own dentist, pulling their own teeth with pliers. Fortunately, on that same Tuesday, we had about 11 patients for our two-day dental van visit that didn't have to worry about pulling their own teeth.

It turned out that Tuesday was kind of a hectic day because our new photocopier was being set up in the parish office by a couple of technicians at the same time as

everything else. A little extra chaos was added because the noon AA meeting that usually uses the library had to be moved to the chancel area of the nave. And we almost had to have one of our counselors hold her private therapy session with a patient in the sacristy because all of our other spaces were in use. Fortunately, the people that were still waiting for the dental van in the library were gracious enough to move out so that the counseling session could happen in a more comfortable atmosphere.

Gordy Myrah once said somewhat teasingly that St. Timothy's is the hub of the community. This past Tuesday, that hub was in full swing.

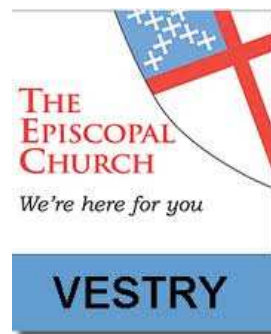

Congratulations to Elizabeth Lindley, daughter of Fr. Bernie and Paige Lindley, currently a sophomore at Smith College in Northampton, Massachusetts. Liz has been accepted into the Smiffenpoofs, the oldest all-female collegiate a cappella choir in the nation.

The group's founding at Smith College in 1936 came shortly after a group of Smithies attended a picnic with their brother school, Yale University, in Northampton, MA, where the Yale Whiffenpoofs performed. Inspired by this male a cappella group, a few ambitious Smithies returned to school determined to establish their own a cappella group. In honor of the Whiffenpoofs, they adopted a similar name and became the first of their kind in the nation.

Today the Smiffenpoofs, affectionately known as the "Poofs" for short, continue the a cappella tradition, maintaining a repertoire of old standards and contemporary music alike. The group performs at Smith College as well as off campus, at area colleges, alumnae gatherings, weddings, birthday parties, charity events, a cappella festivals, keeping a busy schedule throughout the year including national and international tours, most recently to Japan. Following their March 2, 2006 performance in Brattleboro, VT, the Smiffenpoofs were praised in the Brattleboro Reformer: "The Smiffenpoofs are as tight and refined as a group can be. They are champagne and caviar, Newport Beach and Rolls Royce. Their performance of Imogen Heap's "Hide and Seek" has been described as "absolutely stunning" and "a sanctuary of calm...moving, ensemble singing. Just beautiful."

The Smiffenpoofs have built up a collection of several CD's and records over the past 30 years. On Dec. 9th, 2012 the Poofs travelled to Washington, DC to sing at the White House. The Smiffenpoofs can be found on Facebook, and You Tube. Their brother a cappella group is the Brown Derbies. Liz is looking

forward to singing with the Poofs in the coming weeks at Brown University and in New York City. As a "Baby Poof," she is learning quickly, and is excited to partake in the Smiffenpoofs' vibrant itinerary and 76 years of tradition.
