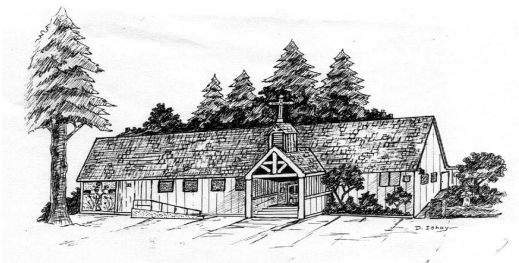

Dear St. Timothy's Church Family and Friends —

I met a guy (I'll call him Raymond) at the Soup Kitchen not too long ago who had come to Brookings for a crab fishing job. The job didn't work out for whatever reason and he was out of money, stranded 322 miles from home. He asked me if there was anything I could do for him.

So I did a little research, starting at the Curry Public Transit office. Curry Transit runs a shuttle north to Coos Bay. The cost is \$4 per segment where a segment is from one town to the next one north. Brookings to Coos Bay is four segments and would cost a member of the general public \$16. But, they give St. Timothy's a 25% discount, which makes a trip to Coos Bay only \$12. The problem was that even though many counties have a public transit shuttle like ours, some do not. There is a gap in the coverage that prevented Raymond from getting to his destination using this strategy. He would have been stranded yet again with 222 miles still to go.

The alternative was to contact the people at South West Point. They have a shuttle that goes from Brookings to Medford where there is a Greyhound station. The people at the Point said that I could get Raymond back to his family in time for Christmas for \$136. I figured that this would be a good and benevolent use of some discretionary money so the next day I told Raymond the news and gave him a check to buy a ticket. Raymond cried. He hadn't expected that I would get him all the way home.

The bad news is that Greyhound ticket prices are subject to change. When Raymond got to the ticket counter, the lady told him the price had gone up over night and was now \$192. All seemed lost for about 10 seconds. But the lady at the Point has some experience at breaking the ticket price down into individual segments in such a way that she can save quite a bit over the package price. After a considerable amount of effort she asked me to write out a new check for \$112, a \$24 savings from the original price. That almost made me cry.

I'll never know what happened to Raymond — if he made it home without incident, or where he slept during the overnight layover in Medford after they closed the bus terminal for the night.

I can only trust that God took care of Raymond the same way God takes care of me.

to all involved. I was told by a employee of another residential home that this is a very much needed ministry as so many of these people do not have family members that visit during the holidays!

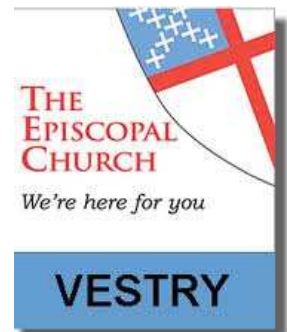

Thank you to the great crews that prepared the ham, roast, set-up and cleaned-up.

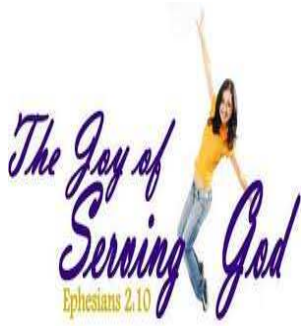
